- c. Comment on the dedication of the lover that the speaker imagined as braving the tempestuous night in his journey of love?
- d. "Into ever widening thought and action/ Into that heaven of freedom, my Father, let my country awake." –Explain.
- e. What are the central ideas in M.K. Gandhi's formulation of "passive resistance"?
- f. How does Gandhi relate the virtues of chastity and truth to his ideas of Civil Disobedience?
- g. How does Tagore critique the rituals of traditional worship in the first stanza of "Leave this chanting and singing..."?
- h. What is the eternal paradox of the worldly man seeking God? Discuss the final lines of "Obstinate are the trammels..."

- a. Write an essay on Tagore's idea of freedom with reference to at least two poems in your syllabus.
- b. Write an essay on Gandhi's views of education and its contemporary relevance, as articulated in *Hind Swaraj*.
- c. How does Tagore's Streer Patra articulate the question of women's rights?
- d. Critically discuss Saratchandra Chattopadhyay's exploration of social realism in his short story *Mahesh*.
- e. Point out the elements of humour in Mahasweta Devi's "The Non-Veg Cow".
