- b. In what sense does the epic narrator "pursue/ things unattempted yet in prose or rhyme" in the first book of *Paradise Lost*?
- c. Critically comment on any one epic simile in the first book of Milton's *Paradise Lost* Book I.
- d. Comment on Satan's first address to Beelzebub, in Book I of *Paradise Lost*.
- e. Comment briefly on the convention of invocation as used by the poet in 'The Rape of the Lock' Canto I.
- f. Comment briefly on the setting of "The Rape of the Lock".
- g. Give an English translation of "Nolueram, Belinda, tuos violare capillos; / Sedjuvat, hoc precibus me tribuisse tuis".
- h. Briefly describe one anticlimax in "The Rape of the Lock".
- **2.** Answer *any three* of the following questions:

10x3 = 30

- a. Critically examine the character of Beelzebub in *Paradise Lost* (Book 1).
- b. Discuss *The Rape of the Lock* as a social satire.
- c. Discuss how the playwright bridges joy and suffering in *The Shoemaker's Holiday*.
- d. Elaborate the journey of the shoemaker in *The Shoemaker's Holiday* from a shoemaker to the Lord Mayor of London.
- e. Critically assess the heroic and unheroic traits in Oroonoko.
